2024-2025 Community Resource Development Funds Background and Rationale

Caring Partners of Morris/Sussex, Inc. and the New Jersey Children's System of Care (CSOC) are seeking to develop/expand services and supports for youth with emotional, behavioral, substance use, and intellectual/developmental disability needs. **This one-time funding of \$67,697.70 (less can be applied for) is available to fund one or more programs and must be utilized from July 1st, 2024 to June 30th, 2025.** Funding is to support new or existing community services that promote child and family well-being, safety, and health in Morris and Sussex counties. Applicants must commit to working in partnership with Caring Partners, other system partners, and community-based services. They must embody the values of Caring Partners and the New Jersey Children's System of Care.

Caring Partners has reviewed recent county and state data and needs assessments that have documented areas of need for Morris and Sussex counties. Applicants should be able to link their proposed activity/program to the needs cited in the RFP.

The priority needs that have been identified for funding are (in no specific order):

- Inclusive activities/services for youth with intellectual/developmental disabilities [3,6,7,8,16,17,18,19,21]
- Youth/family enrichment programs (I.e., recreation, before/after school programs, mentoring, camp, etc.) [1,5,6,9,10,16,19,20,21]
- Innovative programs that enhance emotional well-being [1,5,6,11,12,15,16,19,20,21]
- Resiliency [2,14,15,16]
- Transition to Adulthood/Independent Living Skills Services [4,5,6,9]
- Suicide Prevention [1,11,12,13,15,16]
- Identity-affirming spaces and services for Transgender and LGBTQ+ youth [1,6,9,16]
